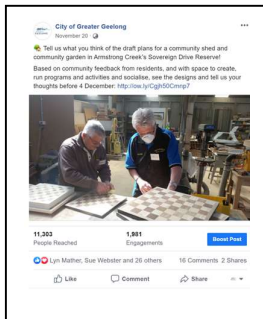

NEXT STEPS

Community engagement is closed for evaluation and reviews. We will be reviewing the results and making changes in line with the feedback.

Feedback was essentially positive about the development of a community shed and included comments on the benefits of community infrastructure in supporting community activities and social inclusion with a focus on ensuring access for all members of the community including all ages and genders, comments suggesting the re-naming of the shed to reflect the Mt Duneed location, some concerns regarding the siting and appropriateness of the development in relation to the potential for bowls facilities in the future.

Your feedback has been considered and the City confirms that the development does not preclude the development of bowls infrastructure in the future as demand is warranted, the City will consider renaming the facility and ensure through user agreements that the community asset is available to all of our community.
