Speeding drivers

- Speeding drivers are a concern on Tivoli/Greenvale Drive.
- The speed humps have reduced speeding at Arenal Street and Komodo Avenue but we had expected to see a greater reduction
- Traffic speed has reduced slightly at Stanley Avenue and Portarlington Road however speeding remains problematic.

Volume

- Traffic volumes have increased since initial counts conducted in September 2020
- This was to be expected due to COVID restrictions in September 2020 and more people moving into the area
- The traffic volume on Tivoli/Greenvale Drive is consistent with other collector roads.
- The road will cater for 10,000 vehicles per day once it is fully constructed.

• 94% of all vehicle movements occur between 6am and 10pm

- The number of commercial vehicles using Tivoli Rd has stabilised at approximately 6%
- We expect the number of trucks associated with earthmoving and house construction to decrease as more sections of the Curlewis estate are completed.
- It is common for roads in new estates to have 10-15% commercial vehicle use during construction, falling to about 5% when the estate is completed.
